

UConn School of Nursing Policy on Course Syllabi

It is the responsibility of the Instructor of Record (IOR) in each nursing course taught each semester to develop a course syllabus. This syllabus should be available to students at the beginning of the semester and posted on HuskyCT. **The template for course syllabi is available [here](#).** Additionally; each semester all syllabi must be *electronically* submitted to Lisa.Soder@uconn.edu for archival purposes. Elements of the Syllabus **must** include the following:

1. Course and Section Number and Course Title*
2. Semester and Year (in which the course is offered)
3. Credits (include contact hours in clinical courses)*
4. Co-requisites and Prerequisites (of this course)*
5. Course Description*
6. Course Objectives*
7. Name of the Instructor (with contact information and available office hours)
8. Topical Outline with Readings/Assignments
9. Required textbooks, readings, and/or resources used in the course
10. Evaluation Methods Used in the Course
11. Requirements for Standardized Exams
