Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)

The Doctoral Programs offered through the University of Connecticut, School of Nursing prepare nurse scholars with a focus in either the Scholarship of Discovery (PhD Program), or the Scholarship of Application (DNP Program). The DNP is designed for nurses seeking a terminal degree in nursing practice for those who plan to have a career in the clinical practice setting as an APRN or Nurse Executive. Graduates are prepared to assume roles as Neonatal Nurse Practitioners. Nurse Practitioner graduates are prepared for eligibility to sit for the Neonatal Nurse Practitioner exam given by the National Certification Corporation for the Obstetric, Gynecologic, and Neonatal Specialties.
