- UConn School of Nursing is now **ranked in the top 10% nationally and top 5 in New England of graduate nursing programs by *U.S. News & World Report*** in its 2018 edition of “America’s Best Graduate Schools.”
- The University of Connecticut has been **ranked 18th nationally among top public universities by *U.S. News and World Report*** in its 2018 edition of “**America’s Best Public Universities.**” With this latest ranking, UConn has been considered a **Top 25 Public University** by *U.S. News & World Report* for **seven consecutive years.**
- The School of Nursing baccalaureate and master’s programs were awarded re-accreditation last year by the **Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) for the full ten-year term.** Two years ago the DNP and post-master’s programs received initial accreditation for a five-year term, the maximum awarded for the first accreditation review.

UConn Provost Jeremy Teitelbaum announced that **Dr. Deborah Chyun**, PhD, RN, FAHA, FAAN has been **appointed as the Dean of the School of Nursing beginning on January 1, 2018.** Dr. Chyun currently serves as executive associate dean of the Rory Meyers College of Nursing at New York University, and is a Dr. John Rowe Professor of Successful Aging.

Mimi Snyder, PhD, MSN, RN serves as the School’s new Director of Prelicensure Programs at the baccalaureate level. She earned her doctorate, as well as her Certificate in Health Professions Education, from UConn. Dr. Snyder brings 30 years of both nursing practice and teaching experience to the School of Nursing.

Carrie Eaton, MSN, RNC-OB, C-EFM, CHSE serves as the School’s new Coordinator of Simulation-based Education and Nursing Learning Community Director. She has more than 15 years of clinical nursing experience, and has experience as both OB Clinical Faculty at UConn and OB and Pediatric Faculty at Anna Maria College.

Dr. Angela Starkweather, PhD, RN, ACNP-BC, CNRN, FAAN, was recently appointed as the School’s Associate Dean for Academic Affairs. She was formerly the director of *Center for Advancement of Managing Pain*, and is a professor at the School.

Cheryl Tatano Beck, DNSc, CNM, FAAN, Board of Trustees Distinguished Professor, is an internationally recognized expert on posttraumatic stress disorder. She has spent the past 20 years studying postpartum mood disorders. She is the co-developer of the Postpartum Depression Screening Scale (PDSS) and PDSS-Revised, which have been translated into 13 languages and are used internationally.

Jacqueline McGrath, PhD, RN, FNAP, FAAN is one of only 150 nurses in the National Academies of Practice, a Fellow of NAP Nursing Academy. McGrath has a joint appointment as Connecticut Children’s Medical Center Director of Nursing Research.
