She has spent the past 20 years studying postpartum mood disorders. She is the co-developer of the Postpartum Depression Screening Scale (PDSS) and PDSS-Revised, which have been translated into 13 languages and are used internationally. She was also inducted into the 2019 International Nurse Researcher Hall of Fame by Sigma Theta Tau International.
